## *Lesson Summaries*

### **Isaiah 51: 1-16**

In one of several passages that speak of the Servant of the Lord, who is called to suffer on behalf of God's People, Isaiah uses imagery that, centuries later, will be used by Jesus and His disciples to explain what the death and resurrection of Christ were all about.

### **St. Luke 24: 13-35**

The Risen Christ appears to two disciples on the road to Emmaus and opens their minds to know the Scriptures and their eyes to see His Resurrection. With joy, they return to Jerusalem to share the good news that Jesus is alive.


