Genesis 9: 8-17

Once the flood is over and Noah and his family are able to leave the ark, God establishes a covenant with Noah, his descendants, and all living creatures, that He will never again destroy all life, with the rainbow acting as a sign of His promise.

1 Corinthians 13: 1-13

St. Paul's beautiful hymn to charity speaks of the true nature of love: attentive, patient, forgiving, hopeful, lasting.

St. Luke 18: 31-43

Jesus attempts to prepare His disciples for the difficult days ahead when He will be arrested and put to death. Unable to understand what he is talking about, their spiritual blindness corresponds to the physical blindness of a beggar.

The Annual Meeting of the Parish of Sackville will be held in the Great Hall of St. Paul's on Sunday, February 18th, Members of the congregation are encouraged to take part in these meetings as we reflect on the work of Christ's Church in 2017 and prepare for our work in 2018.

It is customary to bring the previous year's Palm Sunday palm crosses to church to be burned for use as ashes on Ash Wednesday. If you still have some at home, it is not too late! Fr Ingalls will burn them on Shrove Tuesday. Ash Wednesday is this week, February 14th.

Everyone is encouraged to make every effort to attend one of the three celebrations of the Holy Eucharist scheduled for Wednesday, February 14th which is **Ash Wednesday**. The Season of Lent offers us a time to be renewed in our life in Christ; to be strengthened to live our lives more fully and more joyfully. The spiritual exercises of fasting, prayer, study, self-examination, and sacrifice (of time, talents and treasures) are all designed to move us ever closer to full maturity in Christ.

RESOURCES FOR LENT


