The Prophet Isaiah speaks the words of the Lord's Servant, called from the moment of conception to gather both the People of Israel and the nations of the world to the glorious light of God's salvation.

St. Matthew 17: 1-13

In St. Matthew's account of the Transfiguration we read of the blinding brightness of Christ's appearance, the witness of Moses and Elijah, who represent the authority of the Law and the Prophets, and the voice of the Father, who again speaks of Jesus as His beloved Son.
