Lesson Summaries

Wisdom 3: 1-8

The author begins by stating that immortality is the reward of
the righteous, and then in the light of that belief comments on
three points of the traditional discussion of the problem of
retribution (suffering, childlessness, early death) each of which
was often seen as a divine punishment.

St. John 10: 22-30

Jesus speaks of the close unity which He shares with the Father,
a unity which allows Him to promise that He will always protect
and guide those who follow Him, even to the point of giving
them a kind of eternal life that no one can take away.
